I am a Studio Art major with a concentration in New Media. I also pursue an Environmental Science major, and my dream is to combine these two passions through digital design. My goals include scientific illustration, fostering environmental/ecological education and outreach through engagement with the arts, data visualization, and beyond. This year I have joined the design and production teams of two undergraduate-run magazines, V Mag and Virginia Review of Politics, in order to nurture my future goals with large scale and long term commercial design experiences. I'm excited to be working with both a fashion and arts centered magazine as well as one that focuses on educating and informing the public, as these represent my differing interests and can provide me with invaluable skills and connections.

However, with a STEM and Arts double major, my schedule can be extremely tight, and, currently, I have to travel from my off campus home to the New Media Lab or the library computer labs in order to access the necessary equipment and software for hours of project-based work, which is a large burden. My current personal computer does not have sufficient power or storage to handle the high quality projects I create for organizations, class, and personal work, and buying a fancy new laptop is not an option for me right now. I am applying for this mini grant in order to help cover the cost of purchasing the 2022 model iPad Pro with an 11 inch display, which can help me bring the digital lab home with me in my backpack!

A portable tablet will allow me to create my digital artwork much easier and faster, plus it will open up the ability for me to take on more projects with more ease—personal, academic, and professional. I really believe it will be a game changer for me, in the sense that it will not only allow me to not only deepen my current art practice, but also evolve my skills to a new level and unlock techniques and styles that I can't refine with a mouse-computer set up. The ability to use my hands and a drawing utensil will greatly benefit me, as I come from a drawing and painting background and can more easily incorporate those foundations into my digital work.

My New Media courses, past and future, prepare me to work with a range of softwares and employ diverse techniques in creating picture, video, and sound art. With a high performing iPad, I can shoot and edit video, create animations, work with audio, access image and design editing software, and take advantage of personal digital file storage; I can do these things any time, anywhere! The most amazing part about being awarded this grant is that it would not only help me pursue my artistic goals in a short term timeline, but this kind of equipment investment will support me as I grow my career and chase more opportunities for years to come.

I chose this specific iPad after personal research on tablets and digital art equipment as well as the advice and guidance from my MAS 3rd year project mentor and New Media professor Federico Cuatlacuatl. This grant would unfortunately not fully cover the cost, so I would cover the rest out of pocket, however \$500 would still make this a much more feasible purchase for me.
