Project Overview

In my first year as a Miller Arts Scholar I have tried my best to take advantage of all the resources available to me to become a better musician in terms of grants, music classes, and seeking out mentorships with faculty in the music department and local Charlottesville community. This past summer I was able to get a job working at a jazz camp in Bridgeport, CT where I was able to extend my network and get a foot in the door breaking into the New York City jazz scene. As I look ahead to my life after college, I have realized that what will put me in the best position as an artist is having my playing and writing skills as together as possible when I graduate and also having a strong portfolio of work that I can share to show people what I'm capable of. To improve my guitar playing this summer I started taking guitar lessons with Mark Whitfield, one of the most prominent names in jazz guitar in New York City. In addition, I've started my own jazz guitar trio and rock band this semester to get more experience playing a variety of styles and learning a wide range of music. To improve my composition I've reached out to a variety of people for mentorship including a graduate composition student at the Thornton School of Music at USC to gain feedback on my compositions. I've also been looking ahead to my fourth year distinguished music major project, thinking about what kind of portfolio I want to have built by then. I have realized that to continue to improve I need to continue taking guitar lessons, study more scores for my composition, and start recording some of my own work so that I can start building a name for myself.
