Since I will be using these pictures professionally for the next few years, I wanted to put my best foot, or face, forward. I am pleased with how natural and sleek this makeover ended up looking.

I had an extremely positive experience working with Jaison. Since he is one of my friends, I felt much more comfortable in front of the camera than I would have with someone new, which I think is reflected in my headshots. He also gave me access to all 500+ pictures that we took over the course of the session, which would not have been the case with any of the other photographers that I was considering. Now, I have a plethora of pictures taken from different angles and distances, and with different backgrounds, outfits, and facial expressions that I can switch out and use for a variety of purposes, including auditions and jobs.
