Project Outcome Report

Project Proposal Overview:

Diaspora has always been a part of human history. Coming from an immigrant family, I had to navigate through different cultures. I am ethnically Korean and am fluent in Korean, but I have spent the majority of my life outside of Korea. So, why do I still feel such a strong connection to Korea?

To explore this question, I propose to make a short film and a series of portraits. The short film will feature interactions between the three generations: my grandmother, my mother, and I. This will include but not be limited to interviews, dialogues, and b-rolls. The narrative structure of the short film is very flexible because I do not want to manipulate the interactions between the subjects. To preserve authenticity, the narrative structure will be decided in post-production. In addition, the series of portraits will focus on revisiting the memories through recreating (or reshaping) old photographs.

Outcome Overview:

The production of the project incorporated multiple parts – conducting interviews, reading through family archives, visiting Korea, and finding pictures and VHS tapes of my family. The project outcome features a projection and a short narrative film.

Grandma's Treasure is a projection detailing the voyage of reconnecting with my ancestral heritage. It encompasses various endeavors: listening, observing, tactile exploration, and emulating movement. The essence of this piece lies in interviews with my grandmother and family relics such as my late grandfather's notebook and photographs.

Homeward (working title) is a brief narrative film inspired by my family's principles, particularly the essence of love, especially maternal affection. Centered on the relationship between a mother and her daughter, who returns home after a decade-long absence, the story, though fictional, delves into the theme of love, rooted in my family's ethos. Currently undergoing post-production, it aims to convey heartfelt narratives.

Originally conceived to showcase interactions among three generations of women in my family alongside an exhibition of portraits, the envisioned outcome evolved after consultations with Professor Kasra. I decided to change the presentation to narrate my personal journey in a manner that invites others to embark on their quest to connect with their ancestors. I intended to craft something intimate yet universally resonant, steering clear of the trappings of a mere home movie. As a filmmaker, my focus often lies in delving into the intricacies of the mother-daughter relationship, a theme that has prominently featured in my recent cinematic endeavors. Drawing from the research conducted in this

project, I was driven to create a short narrative film that derives inspiration from my family's core values and the profound concept of love. Through this cinematic exploration, I aimed to weave a narrative tapestry that reflects the essence of familial bonds, particularly the intricate dynamics between mothers and daughters. Through this cinematic journey, I seek to celebrate the enduring bond between mothers and daughters while inviting viewers to contemplate the significance of love and familial connections in their own lives.
