Third Year Recital

We, Josephine Miller and Wesley Diener, are applying for an Art Scholars Minigrant to support our upcoming third year recital and associated fees.

On February 12, we will offer a third year recital at the University Baptist Church. As music majors in the department's competitive performance concentration, we both pursue active opera and art song performances schedules. A third year recital is central to the musical education of a young performer, and this minigrant would greatly enable us to continue pursuing our artistic endeavors within the University's rich liberal arts curriculum. In addition to recital performance, we have also developed our performance skills inside and outside of the University through the Bethesda Music Festival, the University Singers, the Chamber Singers, the UVa Department of Drama, Hoos in Treble, and numerous other performance opportunities.

As we progress through our third year, we have found ourselves in a pivotal period of our performance careers. Over the past five semesters, we have developed our instruments and the changes we have accomplished in our vocal technique and performance habits are dramatic. We hope to put all of our gained knowledge (from academic theory and musicianship training, to performance based musicality) to the test with this junior recital. Josephine will perform three art songs by Debussy, the entire Brahms' Ophelia Lieder cycle, two songs by Argento, and finally a Puccini Aria. Wesley will perform equally complex and impressive works including intellectual and dramatic works by Barber, Ravel, Schumann, and Donizetti. This recital serves both as preparation for our future pursuit of DMPs and also provides us with an opportunity to share our love for music and classical vocal performance with family, friends, and the Charlottesville community.

Our program features an hour running time and will occur at the University Baptist Church's beautiful Music Suite.

With the support of the Miller Art Scholars, we hope to represent ourselves, the Miller Art Scholars, our teacher, Pamela Beasley, and the University with a fantastic recital.
