Artist Website and Materials for Sculptures of Biologically Possible Alien Organisms

With the help of the Miller Arts Scholars Minigrant, I was able to begin establishing myself as an artist outside the academic space. I created a website that showcases my sculpture portfolio. With this, I would be able to establish some legitimacy as an artist and allow myself to be discoverable outside my immediate circle of peers and professors. It will also allow me to apply to opportunities more easily, as my entire sculpture portfolio is now accessible by a link to my website. As I create more art during the coming semester and my time after graduation, I will be able to update and alter the website as I develop as an artist. I purchased two-year subscription for my artist website through Squarespace.

Along with the website, I was able to fund consumable supplies that I was able to use to create sculptures. I experimented with various inks and pigments, higher quality resin, and thermoplastics. Since sculpting materials can become costly, and investment in new materials that may not work out is risky, the minigrant allowed to me take on that risk with financial support.
