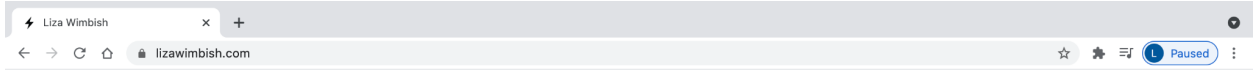


Research and Website Renewal Outcome

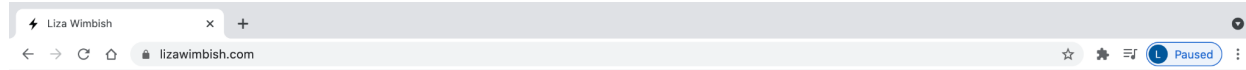
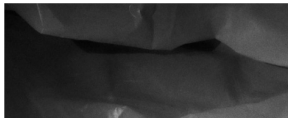
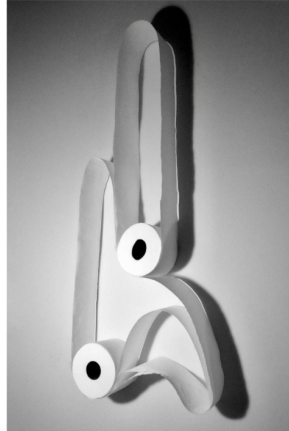
