We'll Hear a Play: Outcome Report

This project has taken plenty of twists and turns, and is not technically finished because I hope to keep working with this equipment and medium, making it a project that can never truly be completed. So, this report is an update on my ongoing project and how I have used the Mini Grant to support my endeavor.

It took longer than expected to get through the Creative Live class series, as well as to figure out how to adapt *The Bear* by Anton Chekhov in an interesting way. I quickly discovered that I was not a huge fan of the original text and found it hard to frame it in a modern context. So, I didn't. I set *The Bear* up in a mountain, in a format similar to the childhood stories I was told when I lived in the Adirondacks. I tried to write it in a country dialect, and make it as compelling and natural-sounding as possible. The actors featured were Bob Lynch, Jakob Cansler, and Fi O'Reilly-Sanchez. Due to time constraints, I decided not to cast age-appropriately, and rather desired to record to listen to the flow of the story itself.

Another reason this project took a long time is that I got held up in the marketing aspect, which was covered by a large part of the Creative Live classes. I spent a long time trying to figure out a podcast name, logo, and general marketing plan, which I ended up putting on the backburner so that I could actually make the recording. I ended up uploading it onto Soundcloud, which is the easiest platform to put things immediately. I also did not edit in sound effects - yet.
