Miller Art Scholar Minigrant Proposal

Graduate School Application Fees

I am applying for the Miller Arts Scholar Minigrant to help fund the application fees associated with applying to graduate school for Acting. As of now, I am planning to apply to at least four graduate programs: Yale School of Drama, NYU Tisch School of the Arts, Professional Actor Training Program (PATP) at UNC-Chapel Hill, and the Actors Studio School at Pace University. I expect that the number of schools that I apply to will increase as more programs are recommended to me by advisors. Further, I plan to audition for the South Eastern Theatre Conference auditions. Since I do not yet have my Actor's Equity card, I must go through a Pre-Screening process in Norfolk on October 26. The total application fees associated with SETC are also quite expensive, with total cost (before travel) around \$170.

Even before admission into expensive graduate programs and auditions, the costs merely associated with auditioning will likely far exceed \$1,000. The \$500 Minigrant Award would provide crucial support to alleviate some of the financial burden I currently face.

This summer, with the support of the Arts Scholars Fourth-Year Award, I was able to attend a five-week acting conservatory program at Yale University. The Conservatory for Actors was taught by former and current Yale School of Drama graduates who have appeared on Broadway, Off-Broadway, in television and movies, and are either full-time working actors or instructors at various BFA programs around the country. Almost 13 hours a day, each day, was spent working on theatre, observing actors, and transforming into characters through the methods of Meisner. I could not get enough. The amount of knowledge that I gained in this short, rigorous, life-changing experience fully inspired me to learn more about my craft. This is why I intend to apply and attend a graduate acting program next year. The schools that I am applying for are the best of the best and selective; however, the confidence I gained from my experience at Yale taught me that I am competitive and desire to be around teachers/actors that share in my passion and love of acting.

I have been very active in the arts community at the University, and believe I have been a model student-performer in my previous three years. I was a performer with First Year Players, Spectrum Theatre, the Virginia Players, The Virginia Gentlemen a cappella group, and the Drama Department. I am also a Drama major, meaning that I've done plenty of work behind the scenes as well such as working in the costume lab for two semesters, co-managing UVA Drama publicity, and even performed as an actor for UVA's Bicentennial Launch Celebration. I have been incredibly involved in the arts, and will continue to be through graduation in May.

I hope that you will consider my application for the Miller Arts Scholars Minigrant, and thank you for your continual support throughout my years at the University.
