However, some of the ideas that I would like to execute require a certain level of technical expertise. Learning new skills will broaden my ability to approach my artistic process with enhanced possibilities. Moreover, as a studio art major, I am beginning to think about the fourth year exhibitions. In preparation, I am engaging in a diverse range of material experimentation. Through the *Sculptural Flax* workshop, I will be able to gain a clearer understanding of how paper fits into my artistic process.
