Artists Minigrant Application - Spring 2020 (ADDENDUM)

Given the current state of COVID-19 and its spread across the globe, many countries have issued strict travel restrictions. As a result of this, I don't even know the state of my study abroad in Singapore. In addition, many theatre performances have been cancelled for the next month or so in order to prevent community spread of the virus. There is always a possibility that the situation will improve by the time I need to use this minigrant, but seeing as it is unlikely, I have decided to propose a back-up plan for how I would use my minigrant if I cannot use it for its original purposes.

### A Study in Singaporean and Australian Theatre

For the past three years, I have been studying and practicing theatrical directing. So far at UVA, I have taken Directing I and Directing II. I have directed productions of *A View from the Bridge* for Spectrum Theatre and *Constellations* for Virginia Players, as well as staged reading of *Collected Stories* for Spectrum Theatre. I have also assistant directed for Heritage Theatre Festival and for the Department of Drama.

Now, I would like to continue my studies of theatre directing this semester. Unfortunately, I am unable to take on a new project since I am currently studying abroad at Yale-NUS College in Singapore. However, because I am literally halfway around the world, I have access to many theatrical productions that I would not have access to in Virginia (and for a much cheaper price). In that vein, I am proposing to use the Artist's Minigrant provided by Miller Arts Scholars to see five theatrical productions in both Singapore and Australia in April and May, respectively.

### **Project Description**

My intention for this project will be to see two shows in Singapore, where I am currently studying, and three shows in Australia, where I plan on travelling to in May. I believe that seeing these productions will give me a good insight into the differences between professional Singaporean theatre and more Western shows, like the ones in Australia. For the productions in Singapore, I specifically chose original works by playwrights from Southeast Asia in order to gain a new perspective on theatrical storytelling. Both are by Singaporean theatre companies and therefore should give me an idea about how theatrical directing and storytelling techniques in a culture that is very different from mine. While Singapore is a modern country, its arts are rooted in Chinese and Malaysian culture, rather than European culture, like I am used to, so original Singaporean theatre will give me a new perspective on theatre that is not available in the US. Then, I plan on seeing three productions in Australia which are more Western in nature, but nevertheless will help me study directing techniques used in professional theatre. Australia has a rapidly growing theatre industry, particularly in Sydney and Melbourne, where I plan on seeing these productions. These shows will help me see the directing techniques that I have been learning about used in action.

In conclusion, I believe that this project will give me a better understanding of the different kinds of professional theatre in two different cultures. Once I have seen all five productions, I'll be able to compare different directing and storytelling techniques and see which ones I found the most effective. I'll also be able to reflect on how Singaporean theatre differed from Western theatre and how those differences affect the production. Then, as I embark on new projects my fourth-year, I'll be able to apply these techniques to my own projects.
