Project Summary

For the summer project Gui Zhou (The Return), I underwent the writing, production, and editing process to create a 50 minute narrative film. In my proposal I had written that I wanted to make a 20 minute film, but the film stretched in length as my script went through multiple revisions to adapt to the resources I received in Taiwan.

The first three weeks (May 23 - June 14) I spent in the research and writing process, along with casting the actors for my film. I got a lot of help from my Taiwanese relatives in terms of gathering resources for our production and we ended up collaborating with the local Fu Jen Catholic University's English department for our actor search which we also promoted on Facebook. I also made sure to film b-roll for the documentary aspect of the project during this time.

The next two weeks were spent on production (shooting calendar on next page). I had written 12 scenes for my film and we had to get all of it in before our actors would be unavailable.







What I got to hone during the production of Gui Zhou – directing, leadership, and Chinese language skills – was an invaluable experience and would have been possible without the Ingrassia Grant which paid for my travel fees to get to Taiwan.



After the shooting process was complete, I began the syncing process for the video and audio recorded before editing a rough cut of the film. I was able to hold a wrap party for my cast and crew and show them a teaser for a project they had worked so hard on. The rough cut of the film came together slowly as I assembled the footage, worked on the sound design, collaborated with a Taiwanese composer, and performed color correction and color grading for the film.
