Salem Zelalem – Creative Writing Miller Arts Scholars Spring 2020 Mini-grant Outcome Report

With my mini-grant funding, I was given the opportunity to purchase twenty-five books. Eighteen were books of poetry, which have been greatly transformative for my writing style. In reading this wide selection of authors, I was able to really study how utilizing different techniques can make for richer poetry. For example, & more black by t'ai freedom ford is a book comprised entirely of sonnets. While I have studied a variety of sonnets throughout many courses, this writer is particularly innovative in the ways that she chooses to adhere to some rules, while breaking others. This has inspired me to work with more rigid forms in my own work, specifically the sonnet but also looking at the pantoum and sestina.

The other seven books were essays about poetry writing. This allowed me to have a deeper understanding of traditions, analysis and common mistakes poets fall into. As many of the books center on African-American poetics, I was able to read more deeply into niche subjects that are not covered within my courses.

This semester, I am a mentor for Flux Poetry and Spoken Word. This means that I will be continuing to lead workshops for underclassmen, many of them first years. As a result of this grant, I am able to supplement my workshops with relevant poems from different books, tailoring my suggestions to each individual student. Reading widely is such an integral part of a poet's education, and I am so grateful for Miller Arts and the funding that has allowed me to grow so much this summer!
